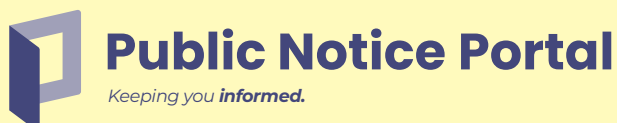

Jackson taking time to reflect

Ira Jackson is set to take a long break from football following his sacking as Hythe manager. Jackson, 28, left the Cannons after a run of 11 defeats in 12 Southern Counties East Premier Division games.

His final match in charge came as Town went out of the FA Vase on penalties following a 1-1 draw against Burnham at Reachfields.

He's been succeeded by ex-Cannons assistant boss Darren Beale, whose reign started with a 2-2 draw at Sutton Athletic on Saturday.

Jackson gave everything during his six-month reign and needs a rest after a testing first job in management.

"I'm looking forward to taking a very long break from the game to recover from all the work that's been put in and what it's taken out of me," said Jackson.

"We'll see if I'm back at any point.

"I won't be around football for a very long time.

"It has taken a lot out of me, not just doing the first-team manager role, but all the things I was doing at the club.

"I definitely need a break and some time to recover, some time to heal as well, because there's a lot of trauma you experience as a manager, which you also experience as a player, but this is a different type of thing.

"I'm wishing all of my boys the best because they're still my boys, regardless of whether I'm the manager or not.

"They have a piece in my life story and I have a piece in theirs, so I'll always keep in touch with them and wish them the best, and the same for the chairman (Andy Nanda) and the club."

New player-assistant manager Roarie Deacon and striker Steadman Callender struck as Hythe led twice at Sutton before leaving with a point. The Cannons are without a match this weekend.

Jay: It's a squad game

Manager Jay Saunders stands by the decision to name a much-changed Folkestone side for their FA Trophy defeat.

Invicta squandered a first-half lead as the second-round tie ended 2-1 to National League South high-fliers AFC Totton.

Saunders had rotated his pack in their wins against AFC Dunstable (3-1) and Burgess Hill (4-1) to reach this stage of the competition.

Doing so again against higher-division opponents was always going to be a risk but the Folkestone boss was pleased with what he saw from the Isthmian Premier leaders' squad players.

"We completely changed our

midfield," said Saunders. "It was important people like Jack Jebb and Ronnie Dolan, as well as Josh Strouts, got the minutes they needed.

"We have shown already this season that we can compete in one-off games. Totton are a decent side and they're having a good season, and their experience showed on Saturday.

"I walked in at half-time and had people like Ben Mason, Donell Thomas and Ike Orji not even changed by me. If you look at the bench, it was very young. If we had more experience on the bench, we might have got something out of the game.

"But we had to make those changes. We had to make sure everyone was right for the games we have got coming up.

"All in all, it was probably a fair result."

Striker Jake Hutchinson's 10th goal in 11 matches put Invicta into the lead on 29 minutes in front of a crowd of 1,053 at Cheriton Road, only for Jimmy Ball's men to promptly equalise through Malachi Linton, before substitute Scott Rendell got the game's all-important third goal.

Hutchinson, 23, had struck in an opening-day 1-1 draw at Chichester but struggled to get going thereafter - but now seems to have done.

"His attitude has been first class," said Saunders. "In pre-season, he was absolutely flying.

"With any forward, they want to get off the mark early on and even though he scored in the opening game of the season - he wasn't quite doing what we knew he was capable of.

"We then brought Josh Strouts in and signed Pigs (Joe Pigott). But Jake kept working hard.

"We knew Jake was a finisher. There's things he can still work on but he is still young. Josh Strouts played on Saturday and Ade Yusuff got through an hour.

"It keeps everyone pushing each other because, if we're going to be successful, we're going to need those options."

For Yusuff, his start in Invicta's Trophy tie was a first in more than two months, having worked closely with physio Paul Smith.

Saunders said: "Ade has been a miss. He has been working hard with Smudge.

"He wanted to get through more minutes on Saturday but

we felt it was the right time to get him off. It doesn't look like he has had a reaction. He gives us another option."

Academy coaches Richard Styles and Kevin Brown took charge of their midweek Velocity Cup third-round match at Welling, the hosts winning 3-1 with Oscar Weight scoring for Invicta.

They return to league matters with this weekend's game at Cheshunt before a journey to inform Wingate & Finchley on Tuesday night.

"It feels like we have been on the road for most of this season so that doesn't worry us too much," admitted Saunders.

"At Cheshunt, the pitch isn't the best.

"Mel Gwinnett's teams are always well-organised so we will need to be right for that."
