Berry's bright future

Teenage Folkestone midfielder Mikey Berry can get even better, according to manager Jay Saunders.

On Saturday Berry shone in the runaway Isthmian Premier leaders' 1-0 victory over Brentwood in a top-of-the-table match with his all-action performance while substitute Ade Yusuff converted a second-half penalty.

Berry, still only 19, has already played for Isthmian South East Ashford and under Saunders in National League South with Tonbridge after he spent his youth career at Charlton.

He had to bide his time for starting chances but now has made seven successive league starts.

Saunders said: "You know

what I think of Mikey and that's why he was one of my first signings. There's so much more to come from him.

"He frustrates the life out of me! I know there's so much more to come and, every time I say something, he says 'I know' so it will click one day.

"Hopefully, that's sooner rather than later. He gives us good legs in midfield.

"Donell Thomas was ill all week. We would have gone with Donell on Saturday because we felt the game would have suited him. But Mikey took his chance.

"Ronnie Dolan came in for Dean Rance and it's not easy when you don't play regularly to come in and play 90 minutes in an important game. I was really pleased with him, as well,

and Liam Smith probably shouldn't have played with his ankle.

"But he was so desperate to and I think that shows what a group of boys we've got."

It's eight straight league victories for Folkestone and also three successive clean sheets for No.1 Ted Collins.

Their latest one against Brentwood came despite fielding a much-changed back-line.

Sam German started in his first match on a one-month loan from Bromley while Joel Odeniran and Montel McKenzie served bans.

"I'm really pleased with another clean sheet," admitted Saunders. "Sam German came in and I felt he was really assured in that back three.

"He came in on Thursday night after already having trained in the day with Bromley so he couldn't do a lot.

"But he's fitted in well. I felt he looked good."

German is the same age as

Odeniran. Keeper Collins is only 22 and Liam Smith is 25 in a defence that's being skipped by 30-year-old Kevin Lokko.

Saunders said: "Sam came in on Saturday and he's 20. On Thursday night, we worked with him being on the right-hand side because we didn't think Liam would be fit, and Strouty (Josh Strouts) would have gone at wing-back.

"On Saturday, we've said to Sam 'You're now left-sided centre-back and Ben's going left wing-back'. It's the way it is.

"But they're a good group and they're desperate to do well, and desperate to keep clean sheets."

Wing-back McKenzie, 27, and Odeniran will now have to fight their way back into the side but

Saunders said: "Every game is different. If we feel players will suit a certain game, we'll pick them.

"Sam has come in and done well, but we'll see how Liam is. We've got a week now and going Saturday-to-Saturday is perfect.

"Rancey has had an illness but, hopefully, he'll come back into the squad and there's Monts, as well. All of a sudden, the bench becomes harder to pick - but that's what I want."

Next up is a Kent derby at Dartford, who find themselves in the play-off places after a slow start to the season, albeit still 14 points behind Invicta - having played two games more.

Led by Ady Pennock, who is assisted by ex-Folkestone joint-boss Roland Edge, the Darts are in improved form but lost 1-0 late at Lewes last weekend.

Folkestone host Cray Valley on Tuesday.

Beale working on his squad

Darren Beale has continued his rebuilding job since taking over as Hythe Town manager. There's work to be done with the Cannons dropping into the Southern Counties East Premier Division bottom four after losing 4-0 at home to Phoenix Sports last weekend. Defender Storm Glautier, who's joined from Tooting Bec, and teenage forward Liam Tullis, on dual-registration from Ramsgate, made their debuts from the bench. And the Cannons have also signed Henry Newcombe in a player-goalkeeper coach role. Newcombe was part of the Ramsgate squad who won Isthmian South East last season, working with Beale, and is training after a knee operation. Beale said: "Liam's a promising talent from Ramsgate. "He's played in their reserve side for a while and got a couple of goals against Ashford for the first team in the League Cup.

"He's been someone I've seen in training first-hand while I was at Ramsgate. It probably wasn't the right game to throw him into when we're 3-0 down but he did OK.

"Storm's come in from Tooting Bec. He's a strong centre-half, 6ft4in, so we've got him in to bring a little bit of strength in the back four as well.

"You need men in there. Every game will be a battle now, a cup final, so we need those characters with that mentality who will dig in for us.

"Henry's a great lad to have around, not just on the pitch but off the pitch as well.

"He's been given the all-clear to train after his operation. "Hopefully I can get him some minutes over the next couple of weeks. He'll be vying for that No.1 spot."

Hythe are without a league game this weekend as scheduled opponents Tunbridge Wells are in FA Vase action. Beale is looking at organising a friendly.

The Cannons' home game with Snodland in the Challenge Cup was postponed on Tuesday due to a waterlogged pitch.

■ Lydd's Division 1 match at home to AFC Greenwich on Saturday was postponed. They visit FC Elmstead on Saturday.

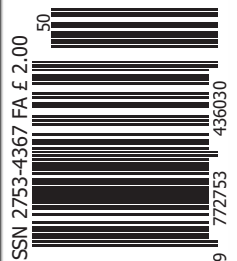
